AOA BADGES

The LGB airport security is now requiring that all pilots get Airport Operations Area badge (AOA). The prior understanding was that students and renters were exempt from this rule. To allow students and renters to be on the AOA area alone, without an escort, they will now be required to get AOA badges.

How to get a badge:

Students

Complete an application and get Susan Baker to sign it and deliver it to the Access Control office. There will be a \$50.00 deposit for student pilots to receive their AOA badge. This deposit will be refunded to you when you get your pilots license and are eligible for your own AOA badge.

Renters/Pilots

All others who are not student pilots can apply for a badge under the General Aviation category. You do not need a signature from us for this. Complete the forms and deliver to the airport office. Under Authorized Signer it should read "General Aviation."

CFIs

Same procedures as renters/pilots however under Authorized Signer it should read "Certified Flight Instructor."

Applications

There are two pages, one white, the other yellow. Make sure you have completed and submitted both. You can pick up an application from dispatch.

Security Office Location

The security office is located in the commercial terminal at the Long Beach airport, 4100 Donald Douglas Drive. Short term parking is available in the parking structure. The office is on the second floor, down a hall on the far north end of the building. You can reach the office at 562-570-2618. When you Pick up your badge you will need to bring two forms of government id. They will be able to verify what is acceptable. Their office hours are Monday-Thursday 7:30 to 12: 00 and 1:00 to 6:00. Fridays 8:30 to 12:00 and 1:00 to 3:30. However, it is strongly advised that you call ahead. Any questions should be directed to the Airport Security Office at 562-570-2618.

CHANGES IN THE AIR

The current Airport/Facility Directory Southwest (July 26, 2012 to August 20, 2012) has a few changes:

1. The legend for airport/navaid listings regarding the operating agency for the airports listed in the directory had numerous changes to clarify the difference between airports with both military and civilian access:
 - Added abbreviation MIL/CIV Joint Use Military/Civil Limited Civil Access
 - Changed CIV/MIL Joint Use Civil/Military to CIV/MIL Joint Use Civil/Military Open to the Public
2. Chart Bulletin for LA Sectional:
 - Airports: Change ZAMPERINI ATCT frequency from 135.6 to 133.075.
 - Obstructions:
 - 10 miles southeast of Palomar (CRQ), add obstruction 696 feet MSL (209 feet AGL)
 - 12-15 miles north of Rosamond Skypark, add obstruction 3814' MSL (268 feet AGL), change windmill farm highest MSL from 3738 feet MSL to 3797 feet MSL, and add windmill farm, 4733 is highest MSL
3. Chart bulletin for LA TAC:
 - Airports: Change ZAMPERINI ATCT frequency from 135.6 to 133.075
4. The LGB airport diagram and the LGB airport/navaid listing had the following changes:
 - RWY 12-30 runway length revised to 10,003 feet from 10,000 feet
 - Rwy 12 displaced threshold revised to 1,351 feet from 1,350 feet
 - Runway 30 displaced threshold revised to 2,002 feet from 2,000 feet
 - Rwy 07L length revised to 6,191 feet from 6,192 feet
 - Rwy 25R displaced threshold revised to 530 feet from 531 feet
 - Rwy 7R/25L length revised to 5,421 feet from 5,423 feet
 - Rwy 25L displaced threshold revised to 1,523 feet from 1,520 feet
 - Rwy 30: TORA revised to 10,003 feet from 10,000 feet; TODA revised to 10,000 feet from 10,000 feet. ASDA revised to 9,417 feet from 9,414 feet; LDA revised to 7,415 feet from 7424 feet. [The four abbreviations refer to runway declared distance information: TORA—Take-off Run Available. The length of runway declared available and suitable for the ground run of an aeroplane take-off; TODA—Take-off Distance Available. The length of the take-off run available plus the length of the clearway, if provided; ASDA—Accelerate-Stop Distance Available. The length of the take-off run available plus the length of the stopway, if provided.; LDA—Landing Distance Available. The length of runway which is declared available and suitable for the ground run of an aeroplane landing]

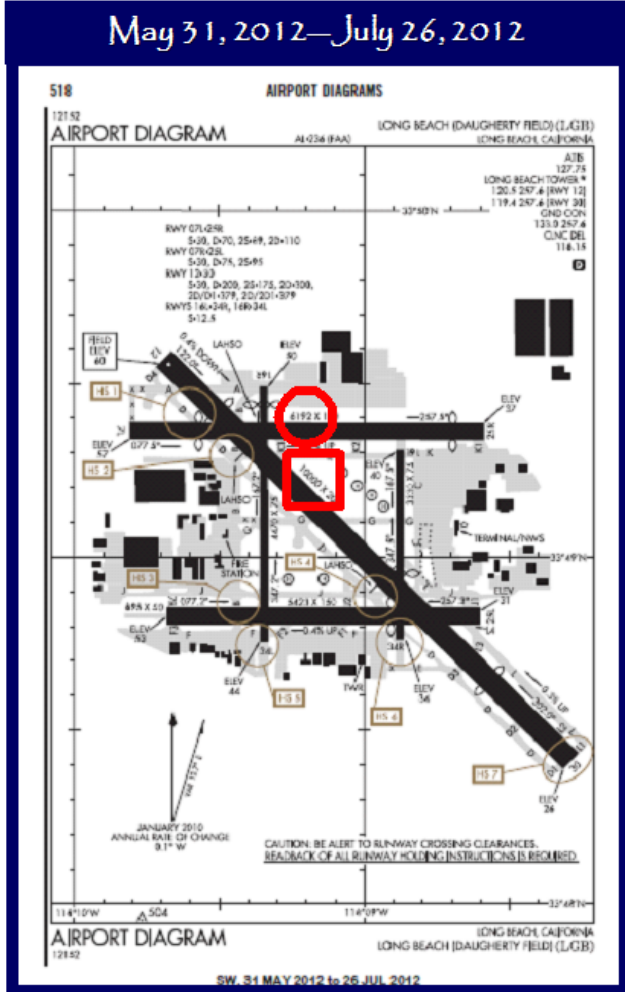
